

Tells us about an experience

Many people live with a serious or progressive medical condition from which they are unlikely to be cured and which may limit or shorten their life. This could be an advanced respiratory disease, cancer, chronic kidney disease, heart failure, a disease such as dementia, or another illness which may not be cured.

The care the person receives should help them to live with their illness and have as good a quality of life as possible.

Are you living with a **serious or progressive medical condition** from which you are unlikely to be cured? Or you may know or be caring for someone with such a condition. Perhaps you knew someone with such a condition in the past two years.

If so, we want to hear from you about a good or a bad experience of health or social care.

Write about as many experiences as you wish, but please use a new survey for each experience.

The care

People with serious or progressive medical conditions need help with managing their pain and other symptoms. They may also need support for their practical, social, emotional and spiritual needs. They may need this kind of care for weeks, months and years, up to the end of life.

This type of care is often called palliative care and people can receive this at any stage following diagnosis.
