### LÁ LÍOFA – COME ALONG AND CELEBRATE LÍOFA'S BIRTHDAY!

First to open Lá Líofa with their fast paced energetic playing will be Goitse (meaning 'come here' in Irish). Goitse are a flourishing, highly talented five piece band who are fast making a name for themselves as one of the most sought after bands amongst connoisseurs of Irish traditional music and sing in both English and Irish. Goitse's talent has seen them enjoying a growing fan base throughout the world. They will come to Custom House Square on the 22 September to get the Líofa party underway.

Nodlaig Brolly recently has become known as one of a small number of musicians currently playing the ancient Downhill harp. Nodlaig is a fluent Gaeilge speaker, and will demonstrate the ancient tradition of ballad singing (and nowadays rarely practiced) with accompaniment on the Downhill harp on stage at Lá Líofa.
