- An effective partnership with parents, guardians and parishes.



CHILD PROTECTION STATEMENT

Unsuitable People

Under the terms of the Protection of Children and Vulnerable Adults (NI) Order 2003, it is an offence for anyone who is on either the UP List¹ or the DWC (NI) List², or who is the subject of a disqualification order from a court, to apply for, offer to do, accept or do any work, paid or unpaid, in a regulated position. This includes any position in an educational institution.

Persons on List 99³

Persons on List 99 may be eligible for employment in a non-teaching post, dependent upon the reason for the original disqualification. The Board of Governors will seek advice in such cases from the Department of Education.
